The 6th Annual Halloween Nude Cruise is a GO! Our cruise is scheduled for Sunday, Oct 29, from 1:30 to 4:30 PM. We will cruise on the Paragon, a sailing catamaran out of Slip 72 at Maalaea Harbor. After we leave the harbor under motor power, the engines will be turned off and the boat will move under wind/sail power. Our cruise will take us to Coral Gardens for an hour of swimming, snorkeling and other water and sun fun. There will be snorkeling gear on board for our use.



This boat has a certified capacity of 49 passengers but the operators limit their commercial cruises to 38 passengers for their comfort. Since most of us have cruised together before, we are going to up the number to 42 cruisers. There is not as much bench-style seating available on this boat as on our previous

Last winter, Tom Collins retired as Mayor, and I accepted the appointment.

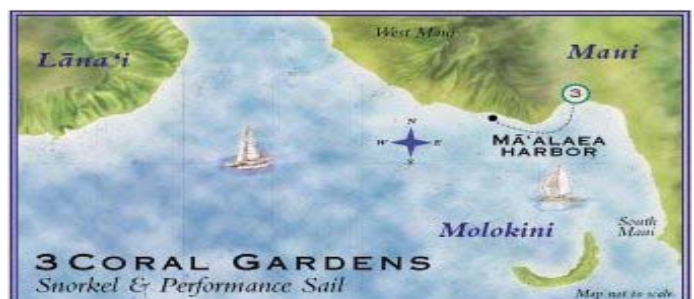

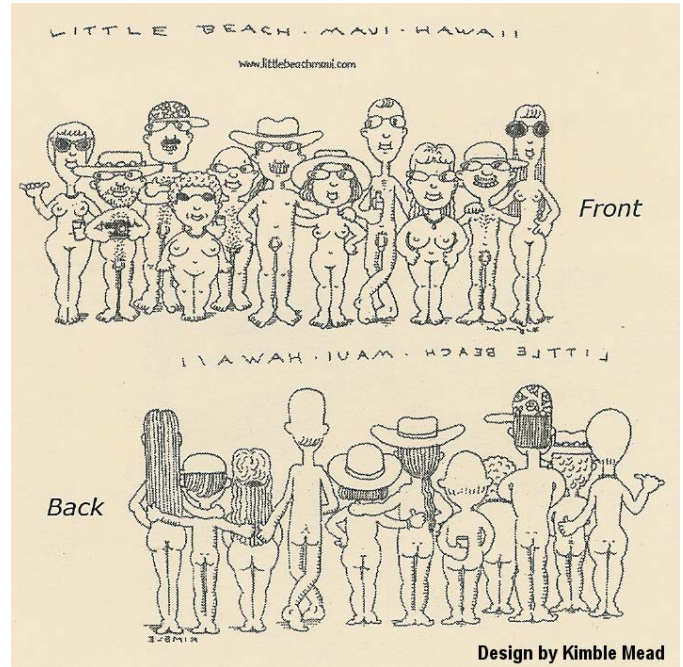

Shark News



On Wed., July 19, 2 kayakers encountered 2 sharks off Sugar Beach in North Kihei. The sharks followed the kayakers for about 10 anxious minutes and then swam off. The kayakers reported this encounter to officials who closed the beach area and used jet-skis to search for shark activity. No sightings were made so the beach was reopened 3 hours later.★



Makena State Park Update

On Sat. Aug 5, State Park personnel changed the signs posting the hours the park was open. The new hours posted were 7AM to 6PM. Formerly the posted hours were 5AM to 9PM, with the gates opening at 7AM. The 5-9 hours were agreed upon through meetings and discussions between various members of the public and interested parties and DLNR Park Officials in 1996. These hours were a concession on both sides to keep campers out of the park overnight while still allowing early and late access, especially for fishermen.



These sudden and new, restricted hours of operation were based on what park officials called a safety issue. On Sunday, July 30 enforcement officers were called to Little Beach because of some drinking and disorderly conduct on the part of a few people there. DLNR estimates there were about 300-400 people on the beach at the time. During the attempt to break-up the threatening situation, officials had to escort many over the path across the lava outcropping. This continued well past sunset and the officers felt this had become a major safety hazard and therefore recommended that in the future the beach be empty before sunset.

DLNR enforcement officers were out in force Sunday, Aug 6, as were many of those who normally stay on the beach through sunset. Enforcement officials let the beachgoers stay until the sun set, and then closed the beaches and the Park.

All of this was reported on the front page of The Maui News on Monday which led to a major outcry against DLNR. The headlines on Tuesday morning reported that the hours had been revised again and that park users would be allowed to stay 'til dusk. Peter Young (DLNR Director) agreed that closing the park early deprives park users of seeing the sun set which is one of the most beautiful features of Maui. He stated that closing at dusk is appropriate.

The current posted hours for Makena State Park are 5AM to 7:45 PM. The gates are open from 7AM to 7:45 PM. A check on the sunset times according to NOAA shows that the earliest sunset in Dec is about 5:45 PM and the latest sunset in June is about 7:10. It is unclear at this time whether the 7:45 PM closing is fixed for enforcement or is variable depending on the time of the year. It is fairly clear from local DLNR State Park folks that there will not be more discussion with input from the public on this unilateral DLNR decision. ✨

Makena Resort Development Update

Recently it was reported that Dowling Company Inc. is in the approval process for the development of a 15-acre parcel of land just South of the Maui Prince Hotel. The plan states that several buildings up to 5 stories tall will be built on the site. These will house approximately 70 top-end luxury condos, with prices starting at over \$3 million. The development will be a gated, hi-security condo complex. ✨

MAKENA STATE PARK FACTOID: *A 2004 Hawaii Tourism Authority Report gives the results of a Hawaii State Park Survey conducted by the Authority. It states that Makena State Park receives over 1200 visitors a day, on average, comprised of approximately 500 residents and over 700 visitors.*
